4.3.5: In-person and remote access usage of library and the learner sessions/library usage programmes organized for the teachers and students

The central library serves as the primary center for the dissemination of information and exchange of ideas among students and teachers.

The library at Homoeopathic Medical College operates on a regular basis, except during MUHS holidays. The institution has a modern, meticulously planned central library with a highly enhanced atmosphere. The library may be accessible via both physical visits and remote means. Diverse actions pursued:

Students and interns use library resources both in person and via access to e-books for journal club activities and dissertation preparation.

Two library orientations are being conducted for first-year BHMS students.

Students have the option to remotely access the library for e-learning purposes.

The introduction of access to e-books is underway.

There are plans to have 5 book exhibits, and each show will invite 2-3 book vendors.

Students have access to a lending service provided by Anmol books stall. The institution acts as a guarantor to facilitate students in purchasing books via an installment payment plan.

7 The library is easily accessible and intuitive for users. The committee members undertake substantial efforts and implementations to fulfill their responsibilities.

The librarian initiates the purchasing process by seeking quotes following the budget allocation, based on the proposal of the library enrichment committee.

Tasks performed on a daily basis

1. The books are categorized based on the academic disciplines (undergraduate level).
2. The books are categorized based on their respective topics.
3. The reading area is equipped with newspapers, journals, and magazines on a regular basis.
4. Online journals are accessible.

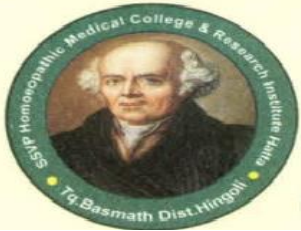
Currently, the library is easily accessible to prevent volumes from being misplaced.

6. Students are permitted to bring their own books into the library for the purpose of studying.

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The library offers a large study area with a capacity of 100 pupils.

There is a dedicated reading space just for the faculty members.

9. Interns and postgraduate scholars' dissertations (referred to as black books) are provided to students for reference purposes.

Needy pupils have been provided with book bank services to augment their study.

In the past, we have received funding from the Social Welfare Department.



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
