1.3.1: The Institution integrates cross-cutting issues relevant to gender, environment and sustainability, human values, health determinants, Right to Health and emerging demographic issues and Professional Ethics into the Curriculum as prescribed by the University / respective regulative councils

Sincere efforts are being made by SSVP to include gender equality, nature and sustainability, human values, and professional ethics into the curriculum in order to foster the development of ambidextrous personalities. When it comes to opportunities, both male and female students are provided with equal possibilities. Participants are inspired to take part in a variety of programmes by the teaching staff. 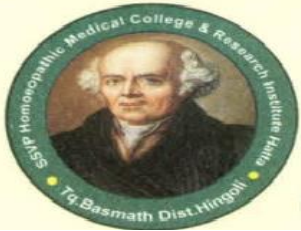
